A lot of behind the scenes work takes place when putting on a festival the size of Bay Days. We plan months and months ahead with scheduling of entertainment, sponsors, activities, and vendors.

There are so many people to thank for helping to make this year's event so successful. Ashland Public Works does a wonderful job preparing the park and setting up the road lane closures. Ed Monroe and I head to Northland College to fetch "The Tent".. The tent is a 60" x 120" tent that is also used for Book Across the Bay. We lug it down to the park and hope that the trailer it sits on will make the journey and...We hope the State Patrol won't pull us over! On Thursday morning at the crack of dawn Tom Fitz, Mark Lake, and a fabulous crew from Bretting's Manufacturing, with the help of the skid steer from Von Holzen's, come together to layout, stitch, and erect this massive tent! Then Lulich Implement brings us two beautiful flatbed trailers and a Kubota to use for the weekend! By noon, the stage is set and the backdrop for the event is ready to go for the next day's preparation. There are about 40 poles that need to be cinched and ratcheted above and beyond the 9 huge steel poles that are placed as the anchors for the tent.

Friday morning comes and we have crews in each area of the festival grounds. The tent crews are hanging lights in the big tent and banners. Other crews are erecting 4 of the 10 x 20 tents for the main events on Friday, Marty's Goldenaires and the Battle of the Bands. The same setup with the tent covered bleachers will prevail for the ever popular Strongman Competition! The Strongman competition is an all time favorite for many local people! We've added the Strongest Bam Bam event, that features toddlers to the strongman contest and it is very entertaining. Blueberry Pie Eating Contest can be seen in the distance under the tent and there are nearly 50 pies in different sizes that are used for this event. Throughout the day, we have to fill 5-6 three hour shifts of crossing guards and another 4-6 people to assist with parking and running people from their vehicles to the festival area. This year Daryl Jolma from State Farm brought his Kubota down for the Friday night festivities. This was so helpful considering the severe weather warnings we endured. Saturday was sure a beautiful summer day! Hot, hot, hot and that is what makes this location so appealing. There is always a nice breeze coming off of the lake and one always has the ability to go jump in and swim or dive off of the diving board! We see so many, many families enjoying Bay Days! I saw three teenagers in their swim suits eating at the Knights of Columbus tent! It's definitely the summer festival!! Lots of food options were had and the games from the Gold Fish, to the Carnival games, to the climbing wall, were all busy. Thanks to Travis Larson and crew for putting on a huge display of games, for kids of all ages, with the Sportsman's for God event, in the grassy area of Bayview Park. From marshmallow fights, to tomahawk throwing there was something there for every age. Lexi Williams brought her Superior Serpents and other farm animals and people absolutely loved them! The 9 dogs in the Amateur Dock Dog Jumping Contest made a big splash and the new pier was even better than ever to view the Dock Dog Jumping!! The course for the Fun Run this year was absolutely perfect with many, many breathtakingly beautiful views of the waterfront and the lake! Saturday night's Karaoke Finals were exciting and the singers were so talented! And the most popular animal at Bay Days was Dufus the Camel! He along with his pony friends gave free rides for 4 hours on Sunday. There were droves of children and families and that's what the summer festival is really all about. Families spending time together! Thank you to all who participated and to our many, many volunteers! Thanks so much to Ed & Maribeth Monroe, JoAnn Erickson, Ellen and Madeline Turnquist, and Meg!! Along with Pat Colgrove, Gary Pennington, Patti Vernon, and all of the crossing guards, tent raisers, & tent tear down crew, and the volunteers working the chamber tent for the three days. Thank you to the amazing Ashland Fire Department and fire fighters who brought the big hook and ladder truck, and showed so many people of all ages the "ins and outs" of the truck. It was very

educational and a great way to see up close a huge fire truck! The Sunday festivities ended with the talented Chequamegon Bay Concert Band directed by Christine Hulmer, and Deb Joanis and friends who directed the Ashland's Got Talent event!

The Annual Bay Days Festival has a lot of moving parts and I am so grateful for all of the folks that help make this event a great success! Year after Year the crowds grow and we are so thankful to all of our sponsors, who contribute to this event, so that we can offer free admission! Governor's Council on Tourism Update:

The Governor's Council met last week in Madison, and I thought I would pass on some of the information they shared for upcoming strategies within the department. Sara Meaney is the new designated Secretary of Tourism and they are hopeful that the Governor's designees for cabinets will be confirmed in the near future now that the budget process is in hand.

Marketing news: The Department of Tourism has a contract with Donald Driver, and will be using him in their Fall / Winter campaigns. The department is in the final production stage of what I think will be a fabulous fall and winter campaign. This administration is very data driven and after reviewing past tourism data, they found a very small percentage of seasonal swing. That means that per season the tourism figures fluctuate depending on the gain or decrease. Wisconsin averages 3% while our competitors to the east in Michigan see a 12% swing and to the west, Minnesota, is at an 8% swing. This is great news and confirms that Wisconsin is definitely a 4-Season destination. With that being said, the new Office of Outdoor Recreation will be paramount to continue to promote 4 seasons of outdoor recreation. Likewise, there is also a very healthy number of Indoor activities offered in Wisconsin, from theater and arts to indoor water parks that boost the ratings in the colder seasons, so this year the campaigns will still carry the "fun" message but also have a "fun" twist with the word Wisconsin. It will say WisconsIN and WisconOut and promote all of the plentiful activities for the indoor demographic and the outdoor demographic. Again, Donald Driver will have a presence and there may be a fun story line with a new character, but we haven't seen the end product. When we do, we will post it on Facebook!

In addition, the department just finished a very swift Strategic Plan and presented it to the council. The Mission; "To inspire travelers to experience Wisconsin". It's too in-depth to dive into, but here is a link to the plan-

The two big events this year will be the Democratic National Convention in Milwaukee and the Ryder Cup at the Whistling Straits Club in Kohler. Two substantial national events that will bring new business to Wisconsin.

Lastly, the Secretary and staff gave the council an excellent overview of the council, their expectations from us, and statutory committees and makeup along with non-statutory committees and makeup and what their goal is in the future to have more diversity within their committee structures. The Department of Tourism has the following committees:

- Tourism Information Center (TIC) Statutory
- Meetings & Conventions
- Sports Marketing
- Joint Effort Marketing Review (JEM) Statutory
- Meetings mean Business
- Outdoor Recreation New
- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion New



These committees are designed to support the Department's strategic plan. Secretary Meaney will be finalizing a strategy of committee make up and they would like to encourage members of the tourism community to apply to sit on these committees. I will keep you posted and let you know when I know the criteria for applying for a committee seat.
