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#### How can you help our local economy?

We always talk about shopping local and we continue to learn and value how important it is to physically shop in bricks and mortar businesses. Bricks and Mortar simply mean an actual store. Every dollar spent in a locally owned business is re-circulated throughout our community 7 to 10 times. Local merchants are owners who receive payment, which pays for their expenses; mortgages, personal taxes, and living expenses. They also pay local employees and those employees deposit money locally, pay living expenses, and the money that is generated further down the line is from money spent by the owners and employees on expenses such as mortgages at a local bank, groceries at a local grocery store and the dollar continues to circulate. The other part of the equation is from the actual business. The Business pays mortgages, taxes, and expenses. The business deposits money into the local bank. The taxes that are generated by the business are generated in the community to support local schools, police protection and fire protection. Commercial taxes are assessed at a higher rate than residential taxes. Imagine if we didn't have these retail businesses that support the infrastructure and needed services such as police, fire, and schools. This is why it is economically important to shop local and shop in bricks and mortar or actual physical businesses.

Online shopping has had a very negative impact on small businesses throughout the country, but the impact has now reached big box and franchise retail as well. Gordman's, maurices, Younkers, Macy's, all have either had to close stores, are closing stores, or downsizing to smaller markets because of online sales. But what is more disturbing is when these big businesses close their doors, they affect the local community in not only loss of jobs and income, but the revenue that is lost from the sales tax and/or the devaluation of the assessed tax on the empty building eventually affects the revenue to the municipality, and negatively affects the services provided by the municipality. The other reason we continue to promote shopping local is because it promotes a positive, social, environment. It IS fun to go shopping with friends! We make a day of it with our friends and family! We enjoy seeing our neighbors and friends when we are out on Main Street or shopping and then stopping for lunch! It's engaging and fun and generates more serotonin and that is a GOOD Thing! Ashland's small locally owned retailers tell us how important it is to have the locals shop all year long with them! They rely on local sales. Tourism is a bonus! But they need the local sales to support their business throughout the year! Ashland is very fortunate to have a diverse revenue stream and economic makeup with manufacturing, medical, education, professional services, tourism, and retail, and it's the Christmas and holiday season that helps our local small retail businesses continue to operate during the slower times of the year. So remember, when you shop local, you not only have FUN, but you can bet you are personally making a difference in the local economy and the services provided by our local municipalities!

This is the reason the Ashland Chamber and the downtown Events and Promotions Committee work so hard to create events and promotions to drive people to shop local!! And we very much appreciate it! The local retailers always give back to the

local community through sponsoring events, donating prizes and money to local charities and local fund raisers, volunteering for civic groups and events, and are members in local organizations and serve on various boards.
