#### Greetings and Happy New Year! from Mary McPhetridge, Executive Director

As 2017 draws to a close, it's time to look back, analyze, and plan for future projects. This past year was a very successful tourism year. The economic impact from tourism in Ashland County was at an all-time high of \$34.9 Million Dollars in *Direct Visitor Spending in* 2016 and I am confident we will see the same if not higher numbers, based on our room tax receipts. The easy way to gauge activity is to look at the parking lots of the hotel properties. We saw more cars in the parking lots mid-week than we have in the past, which is a good sign. Cars in the lots equal "heads in beds" and that equals economic impact for the entire area. Weekends have continually stayed strong and now mid-week is catching up! The State of Wisconsin Department of Tourism will announce the 2017 tourism numbers in May of 2018.

This past year we have seen many changes in our downtown. We offered a new façade renovation improvement program for our Main Street businesses. Gabriele's German Cookies & Chocolates, Moore's Army Navy, the New England Store, 2nd Street Bistro, and Stagecoach Bar & Grill all were awarded a small amount of money to put towards their facade improvements. Our plan is to continue this program in 2018. We introduced some new events downtown and added to some existing events. The Architec-tour had a scavenger hunt element and this year we will be pairing that event with the 20th anniversary of the murals so folks will be able to hop on the trolley for the mural tours and also be able to tour many of our beautiful historic buildings downtown. Witches Night Out had the biggest attendance of all of our downtown shopping promotions and this event has turned into a very social, well attended, fun shopping event. We introduced the "Doe on the Go" event which celebrates the hunter's widows weekend and had many elements of fun included. The 12 Days of Christmas was a statewide promotion we participated in. Retailers offered gift certificates to their stores during the 12 days and we had a social media contest component each day that had a reach of over 90,000 with nearly 2,500 shares!

We are continually looking at ways of bringing folks to the downtown to shop and enjoy the beauty, charm, and uniqueness that our Historic Main Street offers. We were fortunate to acquire two storefronts that we used for Pictures with Santa and.. the satellite store for the Red Bicycle; Lil' Red was open through the holiday. The Christmas season has been amazing and the local retailers want to thank all that supported their bricks and mortar businesses. Many of you enjoyed savings, great customer service, and ... Free Gift Wrapping! I am so proud of our businesses and the Historic Main Street was absolutely gorgeous and festive with all of the lights and storefront decorations!! Our retail promotions are all created to support local small businesses. From Chamber Dollars, to the Christmas Cash Raffle, to the Shop Small Win Big promotion; these all encourage shopping here in Ashland and give you an opportunity to win money!! We have one more drawing in February for Shop Small Win Big, so please continue to shop small and bring in those receipts!! There is yet another chance to win \$250.00 in chamber dollars.. In 2018 we will be sponsoring a Retail Business Contest and offer the winner free rent for the first 6 months, marketing packages, 12 hours of complimentary accounting services, and low interest loans. 
