

This has been a good year for economic development in Ashland. The Ashland Area Development Corporation reports that since January 2014:

- 11 new loans were approved for a total of \$581,000 in revolving ٠ loan funding
- \$4,772,000 in total projects
- 39 new FTEs were created (including the addition of the new Culver's being built on East Lake Shore Drive)
- 25 FTEs were retained
