## Greetings! from Mary McPhetridge, Executive Director

We are celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Ashland Mural Walk Saturday, September 8th at the Ashland County Courthouse block and we have a fun line-up of activities for you to enjoy! The Annual Muralfest and Car Show will run from 9am – 3pm with the cars on display on Historic Main Street starting at the 200 block in front of the Ashland County Courthouse. We will also be hosting Mural Trolley Tours at 10am and 1:30pm. There is a \$5 charge for the trolley. In addition to the trolley tours, we will be hosting the Architec-tour from 9am - 12pm. A map is available that shows the open houses which will include, the Depot, Ashland County Courthouse, Ashland Museum, the Clark & Clark Building, the Masonic Temple building, Ashland City Hall Building, The Wilmarth Mansion, and the Northern State Bank Building. Downtown Stores will have sidewalk sales and also display historic pictures and information about their buildings. The City of Ashland Beautification Committee will also host a Garden tour from 10am-2pm. The Maps will be available at 9am that day and can be found at the Beautification Committee Plant Sale Booth on the Ashland County Courthouse Lawn.
